Overland church of Christ Week3 2021 - Additional Studies on Sunday Sermons

<u>SundayAM</u>: "Church Growth Part3" – The Lord's church has to be a close, caring family. Romans 12:10 teaches us to be kindly affectionate, have brotherly love, honor each other, and prefer one another.

Monday Scripture: Romans 12:10-16

Key Idea: God's people can be really close as they actively serve one another with a humble spirit.

Study Questions: What are the "levels of affection" in v10? What can we do to help with needs of brethren (v13)? Should brethren share the ups and downs of life (v15)? How can we be unified (v16)?

Faith Builder: "Honor" (v10) means valuable, precious –a great mindset to have about our brethren.

Tuesday Scripture: 1 Peter 3:8-12

Key Idea: An abundance of love, respect, kindness, and unity among brethren can attract others.

Study Questions: From this passage, make a list of things that you can do better. What is tied to someone who will "love life and see good days" (v10)? The eyes of the Lord are over who (v12)?

Action Item: Pick one of your brethren in Christ that you need to get closer to – reach out this week!

Wednesday Scripture: Acts 11:22-26

Midweek Edification: Bible study done? Be a Barnabas – good, full of faith, and encouraging to others!

<u>SundayPM</u>: "Be Followers of Me..." (1 Cor. 11:1) – Paul's life is a great example of full commitment, forsaking pleasures, prayer, always acting with a pure conscience, teaching others, and contentment.

Thursday Scripture: Acts 24:15-16

Key Idea: Because of the resurrection, Paul always wanted to have a good conscience in all that he did.

Study Questions: Who will be resurrected from the dead? For the faithful, does the resurrection bring hope? What does "conscience void of offense" mean? Paul had a good conscience to God and who else?

Godly Wisdom: Do not over-due on punishments or under-due on benefits to others (Proverbs 3:27-30)

Friday Scripture: Romans 1:14-17

Key Idea: Paul considered himself a debtor to Christ and his fellow man - he shared the gospel with all.

Study Questions: Paul is a debtor to whom? Paul desired to preach at Rome - had he ever suffered for preaching? Where is the righteousness of God found? What Old Testament passage is quoted in v17?

Prayer Idea: Ephesians 6:18-19 – Which brother can you pray for? Which preacher can you pray for?

Saturday Scripture: Hebrews 10:24

Sunday Prep: Bible study done? Bible/pen/paper packed? Prepare your heart for worship and assembly.
