**SundayAM:** "The Spirit Within" – like each human body has a spirit (heart and essential being), each local body/church of Christ also has a spirit defined by loyalty, joy, unity, enthusiasm, and friendliness.

# Monday Scripture: 2 John 8-9

Key Idea: A loyal church will keep abiding in the doctrine of Christ so that all may receive a full reward.

**Study Questions**: Who should keep what has been worked for? What is the end goal? If someone transgresses the doctrine of Christ, do they have God? What about those who abide in Christ?

Faith Builder: Many worries go away because our life and future are in God's hands (Genesis 8:22).

### Tuesday Scripture: Titus 2:13-14

Key Idea: As we look for the blessed hope, we are to be enthusiastic/zealous doing God's good works .

**Study Questions**: What is our one "blessed hope" (how does it tie to the "glorious appearing" of Christ)? What is Christ redeeming us from? Why is Christ purifying us? What actions should our zeal be in?

Action Item: Call or send a note to our new members and families of Overland over the past 2 months.

# Wednesday Scripture: Romans 8:28

Midweek Prep: God's good to us includes things that are tough to go through - let us edify each other.

**SundayPM**: "Godly Sorrow: What Is It, Why Does It Matter?" - godly sorrow involves admitting and hating sin, shame, remorse, and humility - it is required for true repentance that is part of salvation.

# Thursday Scripture: 2 Corinthians 7:8-9

Key Idea: Paul had a strong rebuke that made the Corinthians have godly sorrow leading to repentance.

**Study Questions**: Did Paul regret that his letter made them sorrow? Why did Paul ultimately rejoice – what did it lead them to? Besides godly sorrow, what non-saving types of sorrow can someone feel?

Godly Wisdom: Protect your conscience so that you always feel remorse with any sin (Hebrews 3:7-8).

# Thursday Scripture: 2 Corinthians 7:10-11

**Key Idea**: Godly sorrow leads to repentance that saves – involves clearing, desire, fear, zeal, and more.

**Study Questions**: What does godly sorrow produce? What does that repentance lead to? When you compare "worldly sorrow" vs. "godly sorrow", which is to be regretted? List pieces of godly sorrow.

Prayer Idea: Pray with Psalm 119:104-105 that you will hate sin and not want to give into temptation.

### Saturday Scripture: 2 Chronicles 34:27

Sunday Prep: How can we show God and our brethren more of an example of tenderness and humility?
